Visitors can be an animatronic puppeteer maneuvering the crocodile tail from the movie "Peter Pan", use x-ray eyes and see what makes 'Junior' move. They can check out Inspector Gadget's gadgets, touch "Pitch Back" alien guts, plus much more...
